Food Pantry

During the month of June \$ 200 was used to buy food for vulnerable families as follows

1. Maize flour. 10 bundles 240 kgs(529.109 pounds)
2. Rice 25 kgs (55.1156 pounds)

Both children study at Kiwanja primary school. Wanjiku's hope for survival is only in casual labour and well-wishers, She has never attended any school in her entire life and this make even harder for her.

Nzilani lives in Soweto slums with her five children her' hope for survival is only in casual labour and well-wishers,

3 adults and 3 children

Grace is a grandmother who lives in Kamae slums. She has six children but one died leaving behind three children. Wanjiru is one of the orphans that that grace takes care of. Due to her age and medical condition it is quite a challenge for her go out and work making it tough to provide for the family.

His house holds has 6 members

3 adults and three children.

Grace Njeri lives in Kiwanja (Kahawa West) with her five children and one foster child. she is a casual labour and raises all these children alone

- 6 Ksh. 300 (\$3) worth of vegetables



Jane Gacheri was born in Meru County in 1993. Her mother died while she was still young, this forced her to live with the uncle. Her Aunt mistreated her and life became unbearable to a point where she had to leave for Nairobi in search of a better life.

Due to the lack of vocational skills and qualifications she is unable to secure a job. Currently her children are part of BOHEI school sponsorship program

This house hold has 1 adult and two children

BOHEI team visited her in June and donated:-

Winnie Anyango is a single mum of two little girls. She dropped out of primary school at class 4 and never went back to school again.

She lives in Kahawa west (Soweto slum) with her children and younger sister.

The younger sister Lucy Adhiambo also dropped out of school after getting pregnant at 15 years. She is the sole bread winner of the this whole family.

She is a casual labourer and during the Covid-19 pandemic life became unbearable to a point of the children being malnourished.

Her first born daughter will be joining grade 1 in July 2021
